COCA Minutes January 28, 2023

President Ergenbright opened the meeting at 10:00 AM on January 28, 2023. The meeting was held at the home of Colleen and Richard Law. James welcomed 27 members, there were no guests and three Corvairs were driven to the meeting.

Old Business - The October 2022 minutes were reviewed. Scott Law made a motion to approve, and his motion was seconded by Pat Silver, the motion carried. The November-December minutes were revised to state that the club will not be fronting any money for bulk item purchases. The individual members will pay for those items before they are ordered. Scott Law made a motion to accept the minutes as amended and David Castiaux seconded the motion. Membership voted and approved the amended minutes. 


Cliff Nieman

Cliff is originally from Alva, Oklahoma, and moved to Oklahoma City in 1962. He has a BA degree in Chemistry, and he went to work for the Oklahoma State Department of Agriculture. In June he will have been married to his wife Lauretta for sixty years.

Cliff's first Corvair was a green 1960 four-door, which he bought used in 1962. Two years later he traded it in on a white 1961 Lakewood station wagon. He and his wife took it on a tour of the Talimena Trail back when it was under construction, and they used it to go camping in Arkansas.



Bob's Tech Corner

Corvair friends...

Although the winter is almost over, lets look at our defroster!

The defroster cable is very short and actuates the defroster "valve" under the dash and opens up the heat to find its way to the Defroster diverter. The "Y" up under the dash. This gives the passenger side windshield most of the warm air when it is desperately needed on the driver's side.

I have found two styles of valves for the defroster. It would seem that there is a 65 style and a 66-69 style. The only difference is in the outlet to the driver's feet!

When removed from my 65 it was cracked in two on the valve. I "plastic welded" the cracks with an old soldering iron and used Harbor Freight plastic welding rods to get the job done then painted the outside.





The next job was removing the staples on the little valve "door" to replace the sealing material. Although mine has been replace, in my research I find many that do not replace the foam rubber seal. So we will leave that issue to your best judgement!

Here are some pictures of my staple removal and replacement with stainless steel wire.





After finishing sealing the edges of the "valve", I proceeded to weld the worn screw holes in the heater duct and the defroster duct.

In the first picture, I sandwiched a small washer on the right side where it screws to the floor. The next picture shows the deformed and missing plastic on the Defroster Duct "Y". The tape is heat proof, glass tape used for a backer so the hot plastic does not not fall through!





The following two pictures show the different types of windshield diverters that can go ion the defroster "Y". The on the left was made out of stiff cardboard and was simply glued to the plastic "Y". An extra support on the side you see was added. This diverter is more like the one that is sold by our favorite Corvair vendors, minus the support.

The defroster on the right is sporting a different style of diverter that was found in the Tech tips some years back and is made with a support integrated in the design! Shown here is one diverter made of small gauge aluminum, the other side is of stiff card board. Both of theses are temporarily taped on. You should also notice that the two sides are simply flipped over to best fit the outlets of the "Y".





Although the originals were stapled to the plastic, your new ones can be simply pop riveted on, as they are for my aluminum diverters in my 68 Monza.

There is another little trick that you can do to get more heat to the driver side as well! By installing a small "gate" or "door" in the short side for the "Y, you can better regulate how much of the defrost heat gets to you, the driver. We can cover that in the future if anyone is interested.

Hope everyone is staying warm. With this little tip, you should also be able to keep your windshield free of fog.





COCA Puffy Egg Bake Casserole

Ingredients

12 Eggs
16 oz of cottage cheese, small curd
1 teaspoon baking soda
1/2 cup of flour
1/2 cup of melted butter
16 oz of shredded Mexican blend cheese or your cheese choice

Prep Time - 20 Minutes Cook Time - 30 Minutes Total Time - 50 Minutes


Instructions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350F
- 2. Whisk together the eggs and the cottage cheese until combined, then add the melted butter. Whisk until combined set aside.
- 3. In a small bowl whisk together the flour and baking soda, and whisk into the egg mixture.
- 4. Stir in cheese with a wooden spoon or spatula.
- 5. Pour batter into a 9x13 greased baking dish. (I used butter to grease the pan)
- 6. Bake for 30-50 mins. Serve with hot sauce or salsa

You can make a smaller batch just halve the recipe and several ladies said that they put sausage or bacon in with the recipe. Make it to suit your tastes..... Enjoy........


