COCA Minutes September 21, 2024

President Jim Gailey opened the meeting at 10:00 AM on September 21, 2024. The meeting was held at C.E. Page Building at Wiley Post Airport.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited. President Gailey welcomed the members in attendance. There were no visitors attending on this date. Jim mentioned that he had seen newsletters for many other clubs and that the COCA newsletter was a far better publication and thanked Colleen Law for what a great job she does on it for the club.

Minutes – The August 2024 meeting minutes were reviewed. Scott Law made a motion to approve the minutes, with a second by Larry Duvall. The motion was approved.

Treasurer's Report- There being no changes to the balances of the checking and savings accounts, President Gailey announced the same and reported the current account balances in lieu of a report from Treasurer Ken Drye. Red Williams made a motion to accept the report, with a second by John Sargent. The motion was approved.

Old Business – Meeting place for driving as a group to the Wichita Roundup next week will be at the Wal-Mart at 15th and I-35 in Edmond by Braum's. It was agreed the departure time would be 1:00 p.m. on Thursday. Ann Ergenbright mentioned that she has a copy of the Roundup Itinerary if anyone needs it.

HOT in Texas/Sam Pack car show – James Ergenbright gave a report on the car show. Twenty-two Corvairs were in the show as the featured car. It was a great event with many really nice cars with a total of 182 cars entered. The only hiccup in the trip was a flat tire on the way home that made a very distinctive sound as it went down.

Swap Meet – Will be held on October 26. The COCA regular meeting will be the same day. All expenses for the Meet will be paid by entry fees. The Club is sponsoring the event so that it is covered by CORSA insurance. Ann Ergenbright is heading up the Ladies' Committee for food and beverages.

New Business – The Fall Picnic is tentatively set for November 9 at the Ergenbright's ranch. Ann will double-check to make sure there are not any conflicts with that date and report back.

The 2024 Christmas Party was discussed. The group agreed that the Page Building was such a good place to hold it last year that it would be a good idea to just repeat again this year. December 7 was the suggested date and Scott Law will check the calendar to make sure it is clear for that date. Everyone enjoyed the food last year, so Scott will contact the same caterer for this year as well. It was also agreed that Dirty Santa will be played again this year.

President Gailey mentioned that he had been contacted about the Stockyards Cowboy Christmas Parade which is also scheduled for December 7 at 10:00 a.m. There was some discussion and a question about who might want to do that event prior to the Club Christmas Party, but the item was tabled until the October meeting for further discussion.

Corvair National Event 2027 – Colleen Law provided the group with the answers to the questions that she had texted to the CORSA officer she knew that had been posed by the group at the last meeting. James Ergenbright added more information after having talked with a CORSA officer at the HOT event. It was announced that the Hard Rock Casino in Catoosa had already declined the event as a potential venue. Discussion ensued. Richard Law mentioned issues he had encountered at past National events where CORSA had not been as helpful as they had initially indicated they would be with questions at specific events such as the Concourse and Road Rally. He also mentioned that some of the events took an entire day to do for some of the more serious competitors. An additional concern was expressed about Oklahoma being a central location with potential for a very large turnout. Questions were also raised about the timing for the next Roundup that COCA would be responsible for hosting. James Ergenbright suggested President Gailey contact the other Great Plains Corvair clubs to see if they would be willing to participate in hosting. Colleen Law suggested that since Jim is going to the Wichita Roundup, he should be able to make those contacts there. The only consensus the group was able to reach was to not make any decisions now, that there is still some time to consider it.

President Gailey mentioned that he had applications for the Corvair Conservation Foundation should anyone be interested.

Road Trips – President Gailey mentioned several potential road trip destinations that were within 90 minutes of the metro area with several approvals and suggestions from the group. With the Wichita Roundup so close, no decisions were made.

James Ergenbright suggested the group ride the Heartland Flyer to Ft. Worth, TX and spend the night before returning to OKC. There are lots of great places to eat there and transportation is easy to get. It would also be an opportunity to meet up with some of the Texas clubs if they wanted to join the group for dinner or breakfast. James suggested this might be something to do after the first of the year when not much else is going on.

President Gailey mentioned that member Dwight Brown had a very nice car collection, and that Dwight might have the group over to take a look at it. This met with approval from the group.

Jim asked if there were any Birthdays or Anniversaries during the month of September. There being none from the group, he announced that his and Cina's 50th Anniversary is in September. Happy Anniversary Jim and Cina!

David Main mentioned several swap meets coming up in the next few months in Chickasha and Norman and encouraged everyone to attend.

John Sargent thanked all of the members who helped him get his Corvair running again.

David Castiaux asked the group if anyone had recently purchased a fuel pump that actually worked straight out of the box. He had purchased a Delphi fuel pump and found that the shaft is too long. He was going to work with it to see if he could make it work on his car. Scott Law mentioned he had purchased an AC/Delco that did have the correct shaft length.

After discussion regarding past minutes and whether or not an official motion had been made regarding the Swap Meet, James Ergenbright made a motion that COCA support the Swap Meet as an official club function and that James Ergenbright and Ken Drye be authorized to expend any funds, they receive related to said Swap Meet for Swap Meet expenses. Any funds remaining after expenses are paid will go to COCA. Second by Red Williams. Motion passed unanimously.

There being no further discussion, James Ergenbright made a motion to adjourn the meeting, with a second by John Sargent. The motion carried unanimously.

Meeting was adjourned at 10:50 a.m.































